Rabbi Seth Farber is a Modern Orthodox rabbi and historian in Israel, best known for his work helping Jews navigate the Israeli religious bureaucracy.

Rabbi Farber is the founder and director of ITIM: Resources and Advocacy for Jewish Life, an organization that aims to assist Israelis with the legal intricacies of personal status—marriage, divorce, conversion, and burial—which are administered in a manner that often leaves families bewildered, overwhelmed, and resentful.

Rabbi Farber is often cited in the press on the politically fraught issues of personal status among Jews in Israel.

INTERN INSIGHTS by Daniel Sherman

This Shabbat will commemorate the yahrzeit of Rav Kalonymus Kalman Shapira (1889-1943), the Rebbi of the Piaseczno chassidic community. A scion of a famous chassidic family, Rabbi Shapiro was tragically orphaned at the tender age of 3. At the young age of 20, he was appointed the Rebbi of Piaseczno and developed a tremendous following, eventually establishing a yeshiva there to educate future generations of chassidim. Shapiro is most famous for his role as the Rabbi of the Warsaw Ghetto, when he offered encouragement and inspiration to the ghetto community during the Holocaust. Many of his lectures from the ghetto were written posthumously in a work called Aish Kodesh or "A Holy Fire". The Rabbi, along with his wife and two children, perished in the war. Besides the Aish Kodesh, Rabbi Shapiro wrote many other works including Chovos HaTalmidim, otherwise known as "A Students Obligation", in which he elucidated his unique approach to Jewish education, focusing on offering the student positive encouragement.
