In 2015, he founded Nishma Research, which conducts research in the Jewish community. Nishma conducted the first quantitative survey of people who have left Orthodoxy (2016) and the first broad survey of the American Modern Orthodox community (2017). Nishma's mission is to provide quality research that benefits the Jewish community, and to do at least 50% of its work on a pro-bono basis.
