February is Jewish Disabilities Awareness, Acceptance, and Inclusion Month! February 26, 7:00 PM at the Jewish Community Campus - a special educational program about supporting individuals with disabilities both in Israel and in the local Jewish community. The featured speaker is Gidi Zur, CEO of Kivunim, an organization serving young people with disabilities in Israel. Israel Emissary Daniel Rivin worked as a counselor with this organization prior to coming to Kansas City.

This free event is brought to the community by Jewish Federation and Jewish Family Services, in partnership with Sasone and other Jewish programs and organizations. It will provide an opportunity to learn about integration, inclusion and independence for disabled individuals in Israeli society, the Israeli government's investment in disabled services, and Kivunim's vision, models and its key programs serving those with disabilities. In addition, some local Jewish and nonprofit organizations will be in attendance to provide information about how those with disabilities are served in the Kansas City community.
