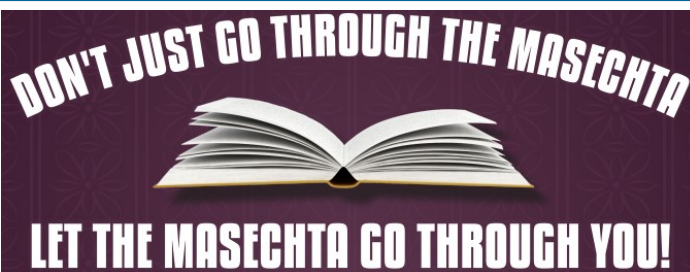

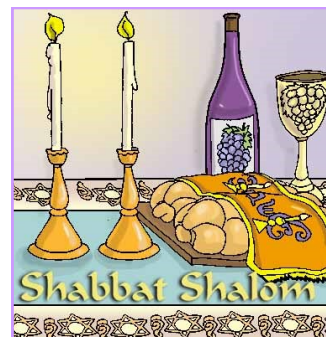
SHABBAT FORECAST

In order to ensure the safety of our children and encourage
attendance in our educational programs, it is the shul's policy that
all children must either be in the Shabbat Groups Program or
