Mincha 6:30 PM

There will be no Seudah Shlishit at synagogue. Seudah Shlishit also serves as *the Seudah HaMafeseket (the final meal before the fast) and should be eaten at home.*

Anything (including meat and wine) can be eaten at this meal and none of the usual mourning practices associated with the Seudah should be done since it is Shabbat. Seudah Shlishit, all eating, zemirot and Bentsching (grace after meals) must be concluded a few minutes before the beginning of the fast which is at 8:20 PM.

Fast begins at 8:20 PM

Shabbat will end at 9:04 PM at which time one must recite "Baruch HaMavdil bein kodesh l'chol" before doing any melacha.

Maariv followed by Reading of Eicha & Kinot 9:30 PM

Sunday August 11

Shacharit including recitation of Kinot 8:00 AM

(Reminder: On Tisha B'Av we put on tefillin at Mincha, not Shacharit)

Kinot will last until approximately 10:00 AM

Youth Policy

In order to ensure the safety of our children and encourage attendance in our educational programs, it is the shul's policy that all children must either be in the Shabbat Groups Program or supervised in shul by their parents. Children ages 5 and under can only leave Shabbat groups when accompanied by a parent. Older children participating in Shabbat Groups may only leave once their group has ended. After shul is over, children playing on the playground must be supervised by their parents. Thank you for your cooperation in this process.
